- Student accepted to and attending a two or four year institution for higher education with the intent to major in a medical or health related field for the primary purposes of bettering their communities and helping others
- Student consistently displays the personal characteristics of perseverance, leadership, the desire to help others, and exceptional work ethic
- Student must be active in school activities, extra-curricular activities, and the community

SCHOLARSHIP REQUIREMENTS

- Student will write a 1-3 page essay on how they meet the “Just Keep Believing in a Better Tomorrow” Scholarship criteria AND explain how they plan to have a positive impact on their community in the future
- Student will include transcript and activity sheet with their application
